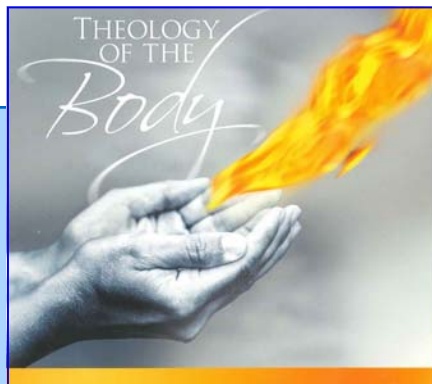


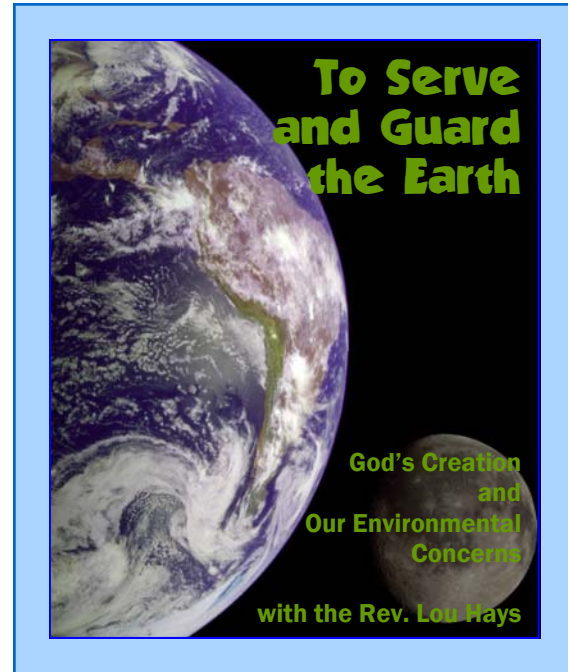

St. Paul's offers adults many different opportunities to explore and deepen their faith, pursue their God-given talents and enrich the quality of their lives.

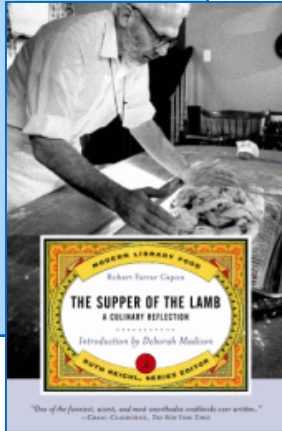

Sunday morning programs



On most Sunday mornings during the school year, we have a program for adults between 9:40 and 10:20 a.m. This schedule allows individuals to participate either after the 8:45 service or before the 10:30 service. Many of the programs are led by a member of the clergy, and occasionally by a lay person. Topics range from spirituality to what it means to be an Episcopalian to seasonal offerings about Advent, Christmas, and other feast days, and many other subjects that can build up our Christian faith and knowledge.

Approximately once a month we have an intergenerational event which usually combines an activity appealing to the children as well as adults that has a learning component.

At certain times during the year the Rev. Mabel Fanguy offers an adult program following the 10:30 service. Topics have included a book on spirituality and a study of Paul's Letter to the Romans.

Wednesdays at St. Paul's

Most Wednesday evenings during the school year there is an adult program beginning at 7 p.m. and ending by 8:30 p.m. Topics have ranged from human sexuality to stewardship of the environment to a range of hot issues in the Episcopal Church. The evening begins with an optional meal at 6:30 p.m.

St. Paul's in the Park

Each summer in late June and early July we gather at a pavilion at Mt. Lebanon Park for a cook-out and a short program. It's a great time for food, fun, fellowship, and learning. Recent topics have included the Blessed Mustard Seed Babies Home in Hoima, Uganda, St. Paul's music program, and the youth group mission trip.



Education for Ministry (EfM)

Education for Ministry is a four-year program of study, prayer, and reflection developed by Sewanee, one of the Episcopal seminaries. The group meets Wednesday evening throughout the school

year with a trained mentor. Subjects covered include the Hebrew Scriptures, the New Testament, Church History and Theology. The program requires advance registration and payment of an enrollment fee. EfM is highly recommended for anyone seeking to go deeper into their understanding of the faith and their relationship with God.

Assistant Rector's Bible Study

During the school year there is a bible study on Wednesday mornings at 9:30 a.m., usually led by the Rev. Kris Opat. All are welcome.

Saturday Bible Study

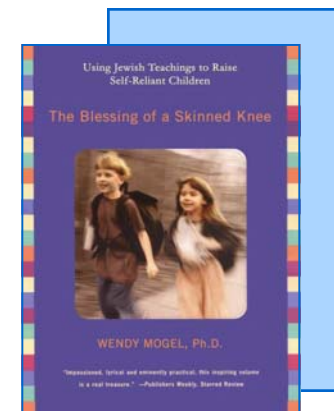
This self-directed small group is just one example of the ways in which parishioners may seek one another out to explore topics of faith together.
