The Holy Gospel**Luke 2:1-14**

The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke.

People Glory to you, Lord Christ.

In those days a decree went out from Emperor Augustus that all the world should be registered. This was the first registration and was taken while Quirinius was governor of Syria. All went to their own towns to be registered. Joseph also went from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to the city of David called Bethlehem, because he was descended from the house and family of David. He went to be registered with Mary, to whom he was engaged and who was expecting a child. While they were there, the time came for her to deliver her child. And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.

In that region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were terrified. But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid; for see-- I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord. This will be a sign for you: you will find a child

wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger." And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God and saying,

"Glory to God in the highest heaven,
and on earth peace among those whom he favors!"

The Celebrant proceeds

We give thanks to you, O God, for creating the world in which we live.
We give you thanks for giving us life and for letting us walk with you.
We give you thanks for the birth of Jesus, so that we might live closer to you.
And so we join the saints and angels in proclaiming your glory, as we sing:

Celebrant and People

The Celebrant continues

O God, we praise you for your works in ages past;

the deliverance of your people from persecution and hate;
the words of the prophets to stir our hearts;
and most of all for Jesus the Christ,
who came to us to save us from sin.
Through Christ you have given us hope and salvation, love and joy.
Now, we come to your table to share in the great feast of Jesus Christ.

And so, O God, we bring you these gifts.
Sanctify them by your Holy Spirit to be for your people
the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ our Lord.

On the night he was betrayed he took bread,
said the blessing, broke the bread, and gave it to his friends,
and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you.
Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper, he took the cup of wine, gave thanks, and said,
"Drink this, all of you. This is my Blood of the new Covenant,
which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins.
Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

And so, we proclaim the mystery of faith

Celebrant and People
Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again.

The Celebrant continues
Most holy God, Father and Mother of us all, we now celebrate the memorial of your Son.
By means of this holy bread and cup, we show forth the sacrifice of his death, and proclaim his resurrection, until he comes again.

Gather us by this Holy Communion into one body in your Son Jesus Christ.
Make us a living sacrifice of praise.

By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit,
all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. *AMEN.*

The Lord's Prayer
